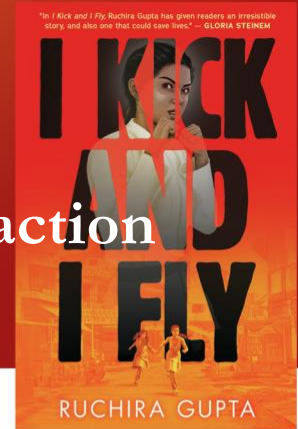

1. Educate Yourself:
